SANCERRE, Domaine Gerard Fiou Loire < Notable minerality, piercing citrus acidity of grapefruit and lime, filling out to exhibit complexity & roundness >	32.00
RULLY 1ER CRU, "RABOURCE", Domaine Belleville, Burgundy 2012 Burgundy < A few miles south of the Cote D'Or, fresh in youth yet rich with age being sheathed in sympathetic oak >	35.50
POUILLY-FUME, Jean-Claude Dagueneau, Domaine des Berthiers 2012 Loire < Beautifully crafted Sauvignon, aged on the "fine lees" to give the wine added richness and distinctive smokiness. Broadening and ripening in the mouth with a full tangy grapefruit and red apple finish >	38.00
CONDRIEU, Domaine du Monteillet 2012 Rhône < Such heavenly charm & character, the description "fine wine" seems woefully inadequate. This wine is full-bodied, vinous & spicy with vanillin notes, dried citrus fruits & apricots. Something to slow-down & savour >	55.00

PINOT GRIGIO, Trefilli IGP Veneto, <i>Italy</i>	< Orchard fruits, a touch of marzipan, mouth-filling with pleasant balancing acidity >	22.00
RIOJA BLANCO 'TREMENDUS', Bodega Classica Rioja, <i>Spain</i>	< Pleasing ripe pear fruit with contrasting sherbet acidity and herbaceous notes >	24.50
VINHO VERDE BRANCO, Aphros Louriero {Biodynamic} Minho River, <i>Portugal</i>	< Benefiting from gentle sunshine and the cooling microclimate of the Atlantic, the wine is vibrant & fresh with notes of mandarin and grapefruit >	26.50

CAHORS 'MALBEC' HERITAGE, Château du Cedre {Organic} South West	< A savoury expression of the Malbec grape - inky/spicy with dried fruit character, reminiscent of spongy fig rolls, with suggestions of fresh tea/ tobacco/ menthol. Cassoulet, duck confit, onglet ..... >	24.00
PINOT NOIR, Domaine La Bousolle Languedoc	< A summer pudding, bright berry fruits with a splash of cream.- fresh on the palate with light-to-medium body >	26.50
BOURGUEIL CABERNET FRANC, Domaine de la Chevalerie {Organic} Loire	< A team favourite; this green and peppery red benefits from 'organic' grapes - the crucial ingredient for great wine and is perfect with lighter meats, game and hard cheeses >	25.50
COTES DU RHONE, Domaine Chapoton Rhône	< Famed for being found in the house of Thomas Jefferson, a long history for a classic Rhône blend of Syrah and Grenache. Aromas of violets, soft black fruits, some spice and silky tannins >	27.50
BERGERAC MERLOT MALBEC, Chateau Tour des Gendres {Organic} South West	< As nature intended, organic, unfiltered and unfined - a wine with nowt taken out. Great value, think Bordeaux but halve the price. Crunchy berry fruit, leafy forest notes and a gentle tannic grip >	28.50
BOURGOGNE PINOT NOIR, Domaine Remoissant Burgundy	< This encapsulates the virtues of mature Pinot Noir with a fascinating bouquet of preserved berry fruits, mushroom, fresher berry notes and hints of undergrowth - give it the bird >	30.50
BANDOL ROUGE, Domaine La Suffrene Provence	< Full of Southern French sunshine this wine packs a delicious punch. Tobacco, leather, pine and dried fruits, a wine that sits up and begs for rich, hearty winter food >	37.50
SAINT-JULIEN, Sarget Gruaud-Larose 2008 Bordeaux	< Second wine of the legendary Château Gruaud Larose, this wine exhibits all the class one would expect. Cassis & pencil box aromas give way to a supple palate with good fruit, balanced tannins and firm structure on the finish>	42.00
PAUILLAC '5 eme' GRAND CRU, Chateau Batailley 2007 Bordeaux	< One of the oldest estates in the Medoc, the name is derived from one of the battles that took place during the 100 years war where the chateau stands today. Mostly cabernet sauvignon this wine is expressive and alluring with fresh acidity under the fruit and green tannins >	69.00
GEVREY-CHAMBERTAIN 1 <sup>ER</sup> CRU, Domaine Heresztyn 2007 Burgundy	< Florence Heresztyn runs the estate, highly regarded for its Gevreys. A vivid ruby-red wine. Stunning bouquet of myrtle, blackberries, sloes and bramble. Floral notes of violets and jasmine, a sustained palate with exquisite finesse and length >	75.00

- MONTEPULCIANO D'ABRUZZO, Cantina Frentano 20.00  
Abruzzo, *Italy* < Not afraid to be bold! Plum skinned fruit allied to leathery warmth with an all over chocolate layer. Dark and full-bodied with a big gush of prunes, plums, dark cherries and a dry peppery-spice finish to keep it in check >
- RIOJA TINTO, Vina Albergada 23.50  
Alavesa, *Spain* < From Tempranillo, the great red grape of Rioja, in the 'Joven' style (unoaked). Bursting with layers of sweet damson, soft plum & black fruits intermixed with subtle spice. A simple pleasure >
- CHIANTI DEI COLLI SENESI, Cantine Vittorio Innocenti 27.00  
Tuscany, *Italy* < Made from Sangiovese and Canaiolo Toscano, this is classic Chianti. A lovely, meaty style of wine with spicy, cherry, roasting herbs, leather and liquorice flavours >
- RIOJA GRAN RESERVA, Bodegas Benito Urbina 1999 33.00  
Rioja Alta, *Spain* < Wonderful mature Rioja that benefits from its extended ageing. The wine itself is pure, smooth, elegant and long with a delightful nose of plums, beeswax and fine sweet oak. A favourite with the experts and wine-drinkers alike >
- BAROLO CLASSICO, Borgogno 2004 {Organic} 60.00  
Piemonte, *Italy* < Unashamedly old fashioned with minimal oak influence. This has a restrained nose of spice and dried fruits. A savoury, tarry attack on the palate with some grainy tannins that melt away after a few minutes. Poised, balanced, elegant >

## Romania

- PINOT NOIR Calusari 21.50  
Banat, *Romania* < Vibrant, strawberry and cranberry aromas balanced with earthy pinot flavours. A real stunner >

## New World

- CABERNET SAUVIGNON, Casa Azul 19.00  
Central Valley, *Chile* < Cherry scents and a hint of chocolate. On the palate it has some richness and soft tannins. A bit bolder than an easy drinker and with an underlying structure, ideal with a burger, sausages and cheese >
- MALBEC, Santa Julia {Organic} 21.00  
Mendoza, *Argentina* < An iron fist in a velvet glove. Very much the grape of the moment, this offers a nose of sweet violets and berry fruit, ripe fruit flavours of cherry and plum with deeper fig, raisin and chocolate >
- CABERNET SHIRAZ, Wangolina 27.50  
Mount Benson, *Australia* < Two of the most popular grapes of Australia combine to produce an 'Aussie' red that will always deliver. Luscious dark fruits, pepper and spice with an enticing "cookies and cream character">
- PINOT NOIR, Petit Clos {Organic} 30.50  
Marlborough, *New Zealand* < Great Pinot Noir, as grown in Burgundy, is all about subtlety and understatement, not lashings of oak. Here we have a superbly elegant wine that achieves exactly that >

South West France	< Monbazillac is the original French sweet wine appellation and is situated in the heart of Bergerac. From the same grapes as Sauterne utilising the ‘noble rot’. Honeyed fruit with a golden lemon seam >	
SAUTERNES, Château Filhot	(half bottle)	29.50
Bordeaux, France	< Sheer nectar ! The nose is rich and aromatic with notes of honey and citrus fruits. On the palate, creamy and well-rounded with further tropical fruit and vanillin notes >
